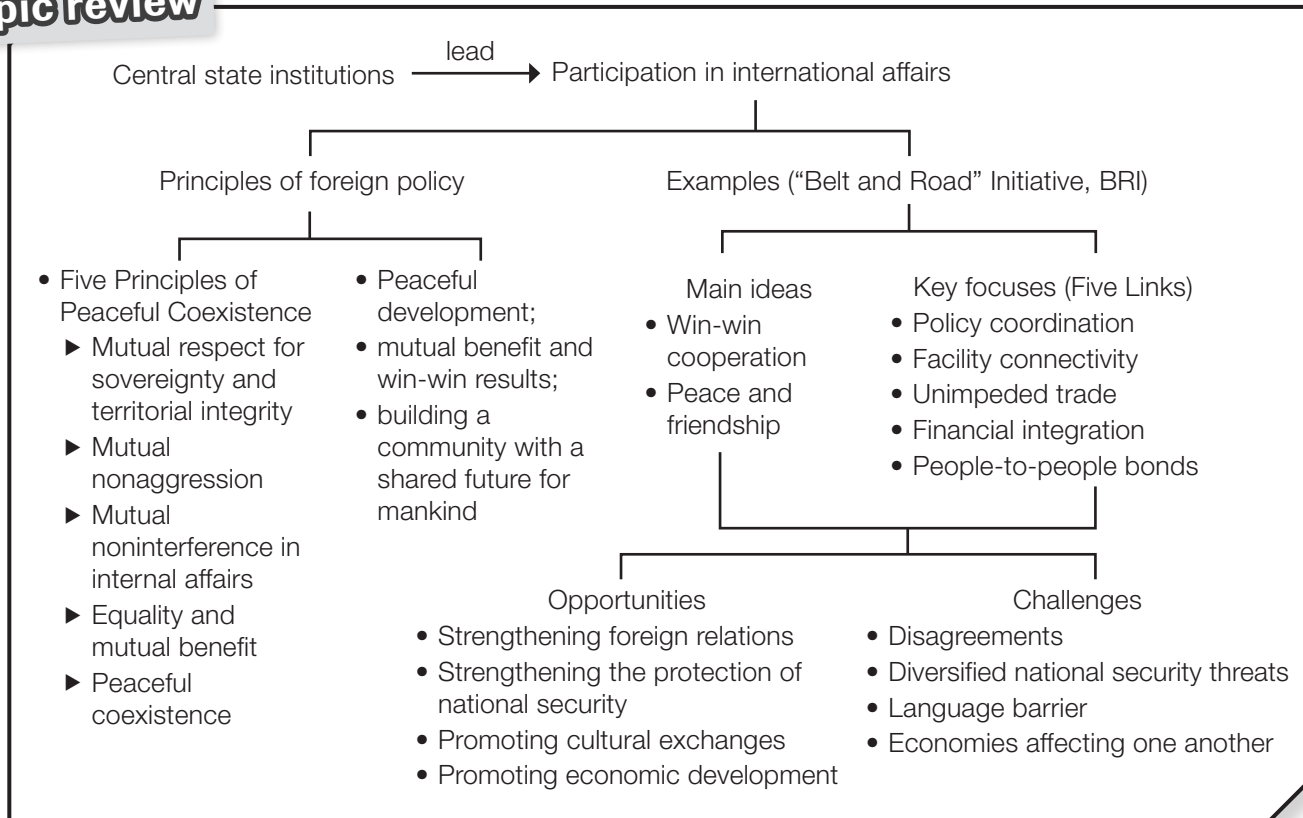

- In 2018, the notions of “keeps to a path of peaceful development”, “follows a mutually beneficial strategy of opening up” and “promotes the building of a human community with a shared future” were written into the preamble of the *Constitution* as the principles of the country’s foreign policy. Refer to textbook p. 26
- The “Belt and Road” Initiative refers to the initiatives of jointly building the “Silk Road Economic Belt” and the “21st-Century Maritime Silk Road” proposed by President Xi Jinping in 2013. Refer to textbook p. 31
- “Five Links” refer to the five major aspects of cooperation between China and BRI countries, including “policy coordination”, “facility connectivity”, “unimpeded trade”, “financial integration” and “people-to-people bonds”. Refer to textbook p. 32-36
- By participating in BRI cooperation, the country increases the capacity of land-based transport and ensures that goods can still be imported and exported by land even when major shipping lanes are obstructed. This, in turn, guarantees resource security. Refer to textbook p. 40

Source 1 Adapted from a news report published on 14 April 2025

The Secretary-General of the Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN) recently stated in an interview that ASEAN is committed to deepening its comprehensive strategic partnership with China while promoting multilateralism to address common challenges. He noted that since the elevation of their relations, trade between ASEAN and China has continued to grow, with both sides becoming each other's largest trading partners. He hoped that the ASEAN-China Free Trade Area 3.0 upgrade protocol will be signed this year, driving cooperation between the two sides in areas such as green industries and streamlining of customs procedures, thereby unlocking significant economic potential.

With reference to Source 1, state and explain **ONE** opportunity and **ONE** challenge that may be brought by the deepening relations between China and ASEAN.

<p>3a Reference + 3b Explanation</p>	<p>3a Reference According to Source 1, since China and ASEAN upgraded their relationship to a (<u>comprehensive strategic</u> / comprehensive cooperative) partnership, bilateral trade has continued to (decline / <u>increase</u>), which has also promoted cooperation between the two sides in various fields.</p> <p>3b Explanation Deepening relations between China and ASEAN can promote <u>economic and trade cooperation</u> between the two sides and drive economic development in both regions. 3a Reference On the other hand, Source 1 indicates that ASEAN is committed to <u>deepening</u> its relationship with China and has become China's (<u>largest</u> / second largest) trading partner. 3b Explanation As China's relationship with ASEAN deepens, <u>both sides will be more dependent on each other's economic environment (1)</u>. If one side's economy is unstable or the market is turbulent, the other side's economy will be <u>shaken / affected / damaged</u>.</p>
<p>4 Summary</p>	<p>Therefore, the deepening of relations between China and ASEAN and the strengthening of ties between the two sides have brought about the mentioned opportunity and challenge.</p>
